Election Regulations - Supplement on Publicity Matters

Section: 1 Notice of particulars of validly nominated candidates

- (1) Announcement of the list and profiles of validly nominated candidates shall include candidate's:-
 - a. Chinese and English names
 - b. photo
 - c. ten subscribers
 - d. brief biography (which is referred to the common and objectively definition of a written history or past account of life)
 - e. office post to run for and
 - f. the assigned candidate number (in the sequence of office categories of Chairman, Vice-Chairmen and other Members and in accordance with the alphabetical order of candidates' surnames)
- (2) The election of candidates for different offices is on individual basis and so shall the formal publicity of candidates be.
- (3) The information provided by candidates is for the use of this election only.

Section: 2 Campaigning and canvassing activities

- (1) Each individual candidate shall have the option of submitting his/her promotional/political statement (政綱), not more than 500 words in English, for posting on the Convocation website.
- (2) Candidates are held responsible for the reliability and accuracy of the information provided, including any URL of other websites quoted. Any posting/transmission of unlawful, threatening or defamatory messages/materials is strictly prohibited. The Secretary of Convocation, who is working closely with the Election Board, has the full right to delete or edit the provided information as appropriate.
- (3) Distribution of electoral propaganda materials is not allowed within the meeting venue of the Annual General Meeting including the registration and reception area. Any campaigning or canvassing activities that may disturb or interrupt the proceedings of the Meeting shall be forbidden.

Note: All University publicities for the election and candidates are co-ordinated and conducted by the Convocation Secretariat (comprising staff members of Alumni Relations Office) in consultation with the Election Board (delegated by the Standing Committee to help organize and monitor the election).
